

Jennifer Frantz lives in New York City. Roger Price and Leonard Stern created Mad Libs in the 1950s and the series has been a favorite among kids of all ages ever since. Although Roger Price passed away in 1990, Leonard Stern keeps the tradition alive by writing new Mad Libs all the time. Roger Price and Leonard Stern are both well known for their comedy writing. In the 1950s Roger Price created and developed cartoons called Doodles, which were turned into a television show. Before that Price worked with Bob Hope on a newspaper humor column, and he even appeared on Broadway in *Tickets, Please!* Leonard Stern has an equally colorful and varied history. Before co-founding Price Stern Sloan with Roger Price (Sloan came later), Stern was a successful television writer. In addition to his creative involvement with over twenty television series and over ten motion pictures, Stern worked with Jackie Gleason in New York writing the *Honeymooners*. He also wrote for the *Phil Silvers Show*, *The Steve Allen Show*, and wrote and produced the original *Get Smart* television series. Recently, Stern published *A Martian Wouldn't Say That*, which compiled weird and wacky memos written by people in the entertainment industry. Currently, Stern serves as

These are a boatload of fun! For the littler kids it comes with a symbol associated with the type of word needed for that blank.....verb, noun, adverb..... That symbol is then the heading for a list of words to choose from for that Mad-lib. It is pretty easy and has the ability to also be instructional.

Kids love it!

This is great for a younger kid who wants to get in on the Mad Libs action older kids are doing. It has lists of words in categories that are marked with shapes to clue the kid who can copy, but not quite read words. Then you can read their creation out loud and both get a laugh.

Big hit with my kids. Once they got the hang of it the stories got sillier and sillier. They couldn't get enough. Great, fun way for them to learn about parts of speech and sentence structure (albeit in a simple way). My kids are 5 and 7 for reference.

7 yo loved it! He could complete it himself with list of words and coresponding symbols. He can't stop laughing!

I love the Mad Libs Junior books. A fun activity that primary students can participate in, so many different titles, great for those long car trips
