

Martin Lings (1909-2005) was a renowned British scholar with degrees in English and Arabic from London University and Oxford University. At Oxford, he studied English under C. S. Lewis, who later became a close friend. Lings taught at several European universities and the University of Cairo and served as the keeper of Oriental manuscripts for the British Museum and the British Library. His friendship and similar beliefs with philosophers René Guénon and Frithjof Schuon inspired Lings to convert to Islam. He went on to become an influential member of Western Muslim society, participating in several international Islamic councils and conferences, including acting as consultant to the World of Islam Festival Trust. He is the author of twelve books on religion and spirituality.

Very well written and useful for understanding Muhammad and the Koran. But be aware that Lings

was an enthusiastic convert to Islam and accepted the orthodox Islamic views on the prophet and the book. No critical questions, but deep knowledge of Arabic and Islamic traditions.

It's not an easy read because of the detail and intricate family interactions, but it is a must read for westerners who need balance.

This book is one of the best and concise. It is based on original accounts such as Ibn Ishak, Wakidi Tabari, etc. What I found best in this one is that the writing is smooth to read. When you read Tabari, Ibn Kathir, Ibn Hisham etc, every statement starts with a chain of transmitters to validate the truth as it was custom then and you lose the track of the subject. Unless you are making a research in the subject itself this book summarizes all the narratives from different sources and gives you all under one cover. What is missing is more information regarding pre-Islamic Arabia, I think Peters book is better for that purpose. Chapters are very short giving you breaks as often as you wish to take without losing the flow. If you want to read one book read this one.
