Joshua Jay is a master who guides his apprentices through every aspect of the magician's art, from the first step—taking the Magician's Oath—to how to minimize nervousness (Rule #1: Rehearse. A lot).

This book actually contains REAL magic tricks, such as ones you might see on stage. It is very well written, and they also discuss topics such as stage fright and how to overcome it (which can be applied of course to other situations, not just for performing magic).

I bought this for my niece who likes magic and she loved this book. It had awesome illustrations and it is such a great size. Such a nice book and hours of fun for kids. I like that this was everyday magic. Nothing super complicated needed to do these tricks. My niece is 9.

Grandson is 7 and loves this book. He has tried several of the tricks with good success and enjoys practicing new ones to show us when we visit. He has made his younger brother his "assistant", providing fun for both.

I bought this book for my 8 year old daughter for Christmas. She and her 10 year old sister are very into doing Magic. She LOVES this book. There are great tricks and they are laid out in very easy to follow directions. They have put on a couple of Magic shows and pulled off some really fantastic tricks. I highly recommend this book.
