

I love James Baldwin, however, whose searing honesty and eloquent prose never fail to carry the reader into a deeper understanding of the human condition, especially when one's skin is black. Baldwin is telling the painful stories within the black community, and the revelation of family matters makes this account all the more compelling, as autobiography, as great literature. His ability to understand those who torment him, to describe his own awakenings in his journey, and his intense honesty make this a must read.
