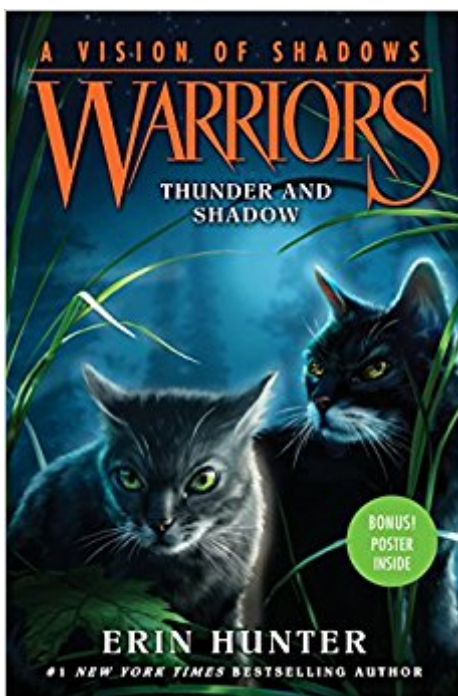


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Warriors: A Vision Of Shadows #2: Thunder And Shadow

I just couldn't peel my eyes off of this thing, like most warriors I read. It's like a disease I can't rid of! Time after time I'm pleased with the Hunters' work, these ladies have to be my favorite authors. I recommend this book to any cat lover, unless you hate reading, which if you do, I'll murder you in your sleep. I'm still not sure if this is a kids book, but it is the parents' choice. ;-D

I honestly loved this book as well as the first book, but I had to remove a star because Violetpaw, Needletail, and Twigpaw were extremely annoying at some parts. Like Twigpaw suddenly needing to find her mother, then sneaking out just to tell Violetpaw that; and then Violetpaw having emotional issues, hating Twigpaw, then two seconds later asking if they'll always stay together. Then there is Needletail. I mean, first she betrays her clan, and now she's with Rain... And Alderpaw doesn't even THINK about her anymore, when it was painfully obvious he liked her in the first book. I love the plot twists, but it gets confusing when every chapter I'm listening to a different cat. Violetpaw is turning into a very unlikeable cat. I mean, she got mad at Twigpaw for not wanting to stay with her, but what if Twigpaw insisted that VIOLETPAW go with HER? She wouldn't go. Violetpaw is always thinking about herself and her needs, and Needletail. I also thought the drama was unneeded when Needlepaw attacked Twigpaw I mean, Needlepaw FOUND Twigpaw. I also found it annoying when Needlepaw (earlier in the series) asked VioletKIT to go to the rogue camp in the middle OF THE NIGHT JUST BECAUSE OF RAIN. I mean, if she cared so much about Violetkit, wouldn't she want to keep her safe? Anyway, I'm excited to read the next book! (a month in a half!) and hopefully the review helped :).

My 13 year old daughter has been reading these books since she first learned about them in 4th grade. It's her favorite series, she is an avid reader, and likes different genres but these books are her all time favorite.

I liked the first book in A Vision of Shadows series of Warriors, but this one I felt was overwhelmingly frustrating due to Violetpaw and Twigpaw. Both sisters are too self-centered for the

most of the book. However, they did each have a moment that redeemed them for a while until their self-centered issues brought them down again. I'm not really finding Violetpaw a likable cat to be honest and hope she improves in subsequent books. The last chapters saved this second book of the series for me. I disliked the point of view characters so much at times I'd rather read Jayfeather fussing then to read more about Twigpaw, Violetpaw and Alderpaw. This book took me quite a long time to read because I didn't particularly feel it was a strong Erin Hunter book. It came across as fluff, contrived drama to stretch a story line for six book series. It read like that until near the end, but I did finally come across the big scene and changed my opinion from a two-star rating to a four-star. SPOILER Although, Graystripe wanted Sparkpelt to be named Sparkfire after Firestar because she most resembled him, I'm glad that it was Alderpaw that was named Alderheart, who I'm not sure was named after Firestar on purpose or not (Fireheart being his warrior name). Alderheart is most definitely more like Firestar in his personality and in actions protecting his clan. (I miss Firestar)

After waiting for a while for this to come in I read each of the series over again. I must say this one has come to a unexpected turn. Alderheart and Sparkpelt finally have gotten their names and I must agree that Sparkfire would have been a better choice of a name for Sparkpelt. It kinda annoyed me that Needletail chooses the rouges who ran out SkyClan and was going to kill her, Alderheart and the rest of the ThunderClan patrol in the first book. Adding onto that she revolted against Rowanstar's decision on sending the rouges away, and acted as though she didn't understand why. It surprised me that the rouges took over ShadowClan, especially when they just lost their deputy and the clan was recovering from Yellowcough. Hopefully in the next book Rowanstar gets his control back over his clan and exile Needletail, Sleekwhisker and Juniperclaw. I figure that the next book they will treat the rouges just like the Dark Forest cats. I am glad to see Echosong back, and hopefully they will bring SkyClan back to the other four clans where they belong.

The Adventures of the clans continue in the perspective of Alderpaw, Violetkit, and Twigkit as the threat of the rogues continues to strike fear in the clans and the question still remains...Where is SkyClan? So much happens in this book, this story arc in the Warriors series sends back those familiar chills down my spine just like when I was reading the Original Arc alongside Fireheart. It's an amazing book even better than the first and I will continue looking forward to reading the next book (next year...;_;)!

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
