

I wanted to love this memoir, but in the end I found it flawed. Perhaps it would have worked better as a much shorter magazine article. As written, it is often repetitious--lots of crying scenes, lots of swimming scenes. Another issue for me was that Simon's computer voice is mentioned a number of times, but little of what he has to say is included in the book. Even though this is his wife's story about living with Simon's illness, it didn't work well for me without Simon. I wanted more about him and a bit less about tears and swimming.
