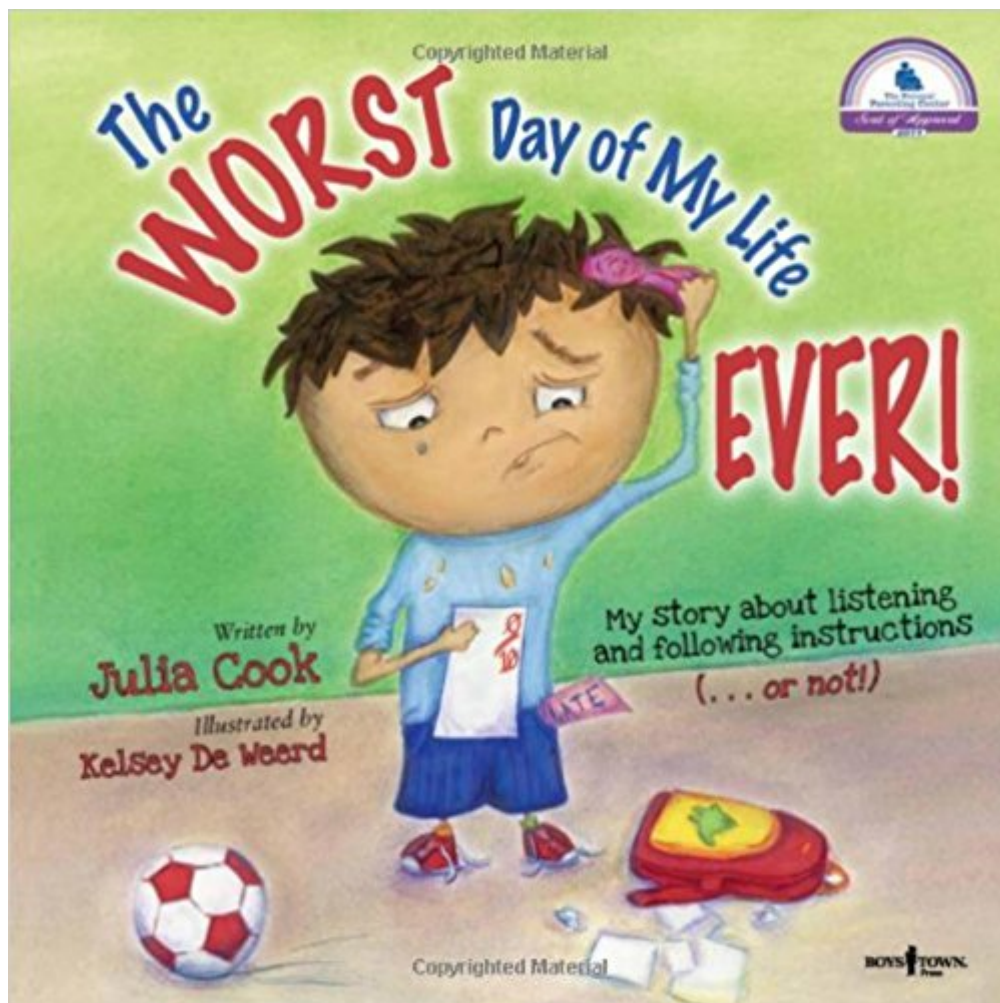

I have several of Julia Cook's books and love reading them with the kids I work with. This book

gives great, concrete ideas about listening and following instructions (there's even a little rhyming poem about each!) but it is given in such a way so that kids still enjoy the story! In fact, I have kids who specifically ask to read this book over and over! Given that some books make the kids sigh, roll their eyes, and ask "do we HAVE to?" I count this book's appeal as a HUGE plus! That said, it is not a be-all, end-all tool for teaching kids these skills -- adults should be reading and discussing these ideas WITH their kids too! With all of these stories, the child and I follow up during and after the story with questions or discussion, such as "What do you think RJ could do differently?" or "How do you think RJ was feeling that morning?" The interaction and discussion is just as important as reading the story and I feel that this story does a super job of opening the door in a fun way for these discussions. The language is also easy enough that many kids can read this themselves, if they wish to. All in all: HIGHLY recommend!

I like that the message isn't just about how to listen but also that it shows the different cause and effect of when RJ makes a choice to listen and follow instructions and when he does not. It's a good starting point and overall got the message across that when we choose to listen and follow instructions our days are better.

.... Not to say that he will continue listening without us going back to this book often (which we will). But it's true! We read it, he intently listened to it. Afterward he told me of some times he should have listened (like when he busted his foot open because he was pressing down on a glass top table, which I had told him time and time again to not lean on the furniture... or the time he busted his lip open when he was sliding and pressing down on a sliding wheel table, which, again, I had told him not to lean on furniture...) Anyways, after reading this book he was behaving like a much better listener. Must more responsive. Following directions better. Yay!
