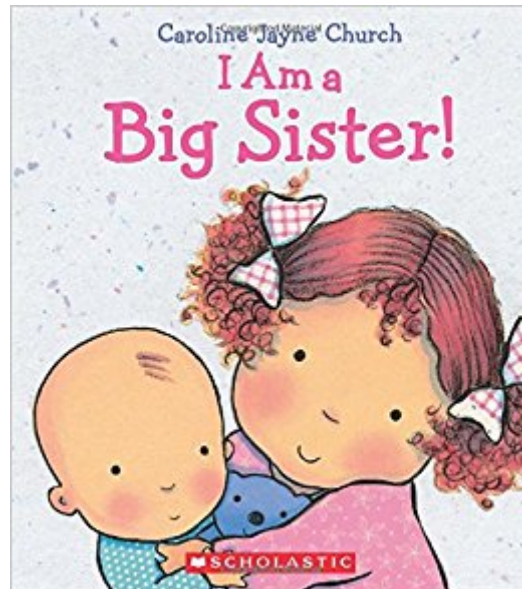

This was one of several "big sister" type of books we bought for our toddler when we started introducing our daughter to the concept of having another baby in the house. The story is simple enough for an under 2 year old to grasp, the illustrations are clear, and the general message is that a big sister can take a helpful and active role in caring for and playing with the new sibling. We generally hold Caroline Jayne Church's board books in high regard at our house, and this book is one of the ones our now 22 month old picks frequently out of the shelf to read with me. From a parent's point of view, it's not awful, it's not the best ever board book on the subject we've ever seen, as the book - and most of its kind - starts from the baby already being here, when introducing the concept of "don't jump on Mommy's tummy, it hurts" to a rowdy toddler is still a priority. Note to the "Crunchy" crowd: Our absolute favorite big sibling board books are from Rachel Fuller's "New Baby" set (a total of 4 books, we currently have 2; "Waiting for Baby" and "My New Baby"), as they are better aligned with our "crunchy" parenting style, "My New Baby" includes breastfeeding and babywearing in a tasteful way that treats nursing as normal, and the mom in the pictures doesn't "whip it out", as some breastfeeding critics might say. I also appreciate that Fuller's "Waiting for Baby" incorporates going to prenatal appointments and ultrasounds with Mom, and toddler and Dad fixing up dinner while tired, heavily pregnant Mom is resting, an all too common sight at our house since I've had numerous health issues throughout my pregnancy, and require frequent rest, so Daddy being shown participating in the preparation for baby is greatly appreciated.

We bought this as a gift for our niece and family, but if it's anything like "I Am A Big Brother," then it's definitely a 5-star book. (We have and read that with our son). These are quality books to help your little one better understand their younger sibling, as well as their role as the older sibling. Good way to help them understand how a family works. And a good book to read before bedtime!

My three year old loves this book. Sometimes more than she loves her new brother lol. She wants me to read it to her often and remembers some of the pages by the pictures alone so she "reads" it to me and her baby brother too.

Love this book. So does our 20 month old. The illustrations are cute, and it goes through a typical

day full of things with a new baby; changing a diaper, giving a bath, playing quietly while baby sleeps, etc. It encourages the big sister to be involved and helpful. It also stresses that you will always be a big sister now. Very cute.

What a great story to introduce your child to a big life change. My daughter and I read this story many times before our next child was born. She is such a great big sister and sometimes I quote from the book when she helps with a blanket or bottle. She gets the biggest smile on her face with a look of accomplishment. I think reading this story has helped with the transition of a new baby in the home. Only negative I would say is that the board book has thinner pages than most and could be ripped if a child puts their mind to it and the pages seem to stick together easier. Not the best quality but has held up well and the story is so cute that we read it multiple times in a day.

Perfect for granddaughter, who is 2 and expecting a sister soon. Book makes child feel secure in her position in family and not feel threatened by new arrival. It addresses all the things the baby will not be able to do, preparing the child for things they should not do to baby when it arrives home.

Thoughtful gift for sibling of the new baby. Young children may not understand, and often feel "forgotten" when gifts arrive for their new baby brother or sister. This small token lets them know they are also an important part of baby's life.
