My son LOVES these. It's a game to him and he loves going through them and feeling that sense of accomplishment as he gets the answers right. It helps us also review some areas he is not as familiar with such as coin values, telling time, and recognizing some numbers and letters. He is 3.5 years old and has already gone through the deck that precedes this one, so I got him the 4-5 and the 5-6 year decks as well to see where he is on those levels and start exposing him to more things he is not as comfortable with. He still loves them and is doing great. I love that the presentation makes it like a game to him so it's not laborious. He actually asks me and his dad to play the game with him. =)

I bought these to use with my four year old. They are a great tool for encouraging descriptive conversations while teaching/reviewing the preschool basics. My daughter loves sitting with me while we flip through one of the two decks. There are helpful tips for parents on how to get the most out of these cards. Some of the questions in the deck are really easy, while some will require help. In all, these are a great teaching tool to throw into the mix when teaching your preschooler the basics

Got this for my 3.5 year old daughter who is currently in preschool. She didn't want to stop the first night I brought it out--she was having that much fun. She even asks to do the 'game with the cards.' There were some questions she had more trouble with than others (patterns, sequences), but I'd say she aced about 85% of the questions. I immediately ordered the age 5-6 version and plan to get her started on that soon. This comes with two fan decks in the set (different questions). Very easy to put in my purse. We brought it to a relative's home and to restaurants.

Good game, but some of the questions are too easy for 5 - 6 year olds. There are some that are difficult, it is true. But those are ones a child would not have encountered until school or with specific instruction (like money or time). I guess it is a good mix of questions, but I would have liked some more challenging ones in the deck.

These are great for traveling or long waits in the doctor's office. Such a great way to pass time and

interact with your child and it's educational too! These cards cover a variety of topics on each "page" which kept my twins from getting bored. The package contained two decks so I can do one with each twin or rotate them to keep the questions from getting too familiar. Love these and we'll definitely be back for more.

I am addicted to Brain Quest cards. My daughters, 3 and 5, get such a kick out of them and have learned a great deal. The questions are very age appropriate, but at the same time, challenging enough not to become boring. The deck comes in a connected, fan-like manner which makes it very easy to go through each card. This is a great way to expand your child's knowledge with a simple, quick activity.

These Brain Quest brand cards are something that I have been buying for years. I have a 14 year old daughter that got a new set of these every year for her birthday. She always loved them and it was always so much fun going through them together. I am going to continue the tradition with my son and give him a set each year! He is 3 now and really loves going through these together. These cards are a really great gift idea for any child in this age range
