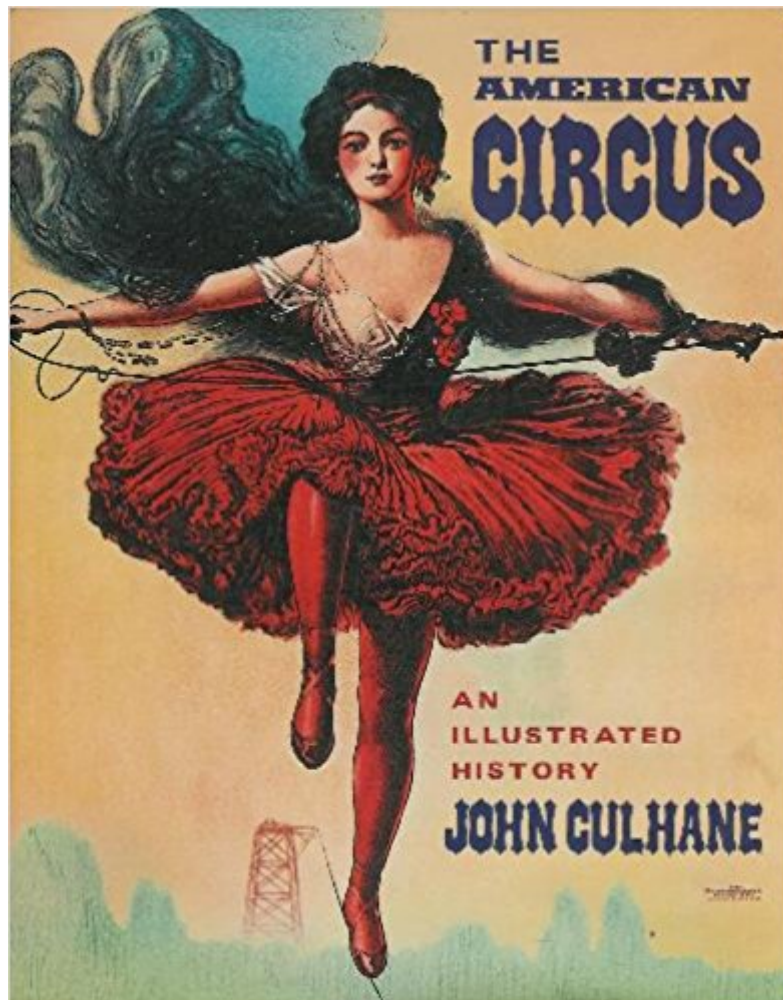




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American Circus: An Illustrated History

It is sure to be a valuable reference source as well as entertaining reading. It's all here: the first elephant to be exhibited in the United States, the pursuit by daredevil high flyers of the quadruple somersault, the daring and skill of Gunther Gebel-Williams, and, yes, "The Living Unicorn."
