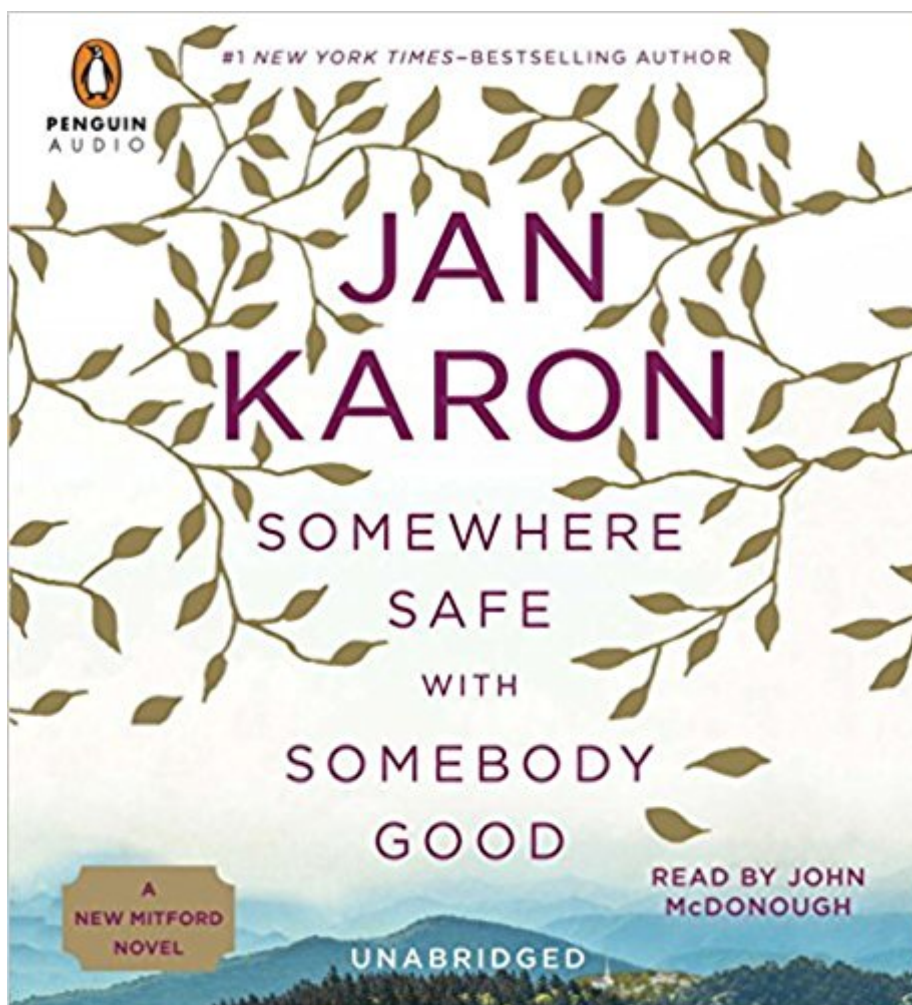


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Somewhere Safe With Somebody Good (Mitford)

'Somewhere Safe with Somebody Good' is the latest and much anticipated continuation of the Mitford series; although one would not necessarily have to have read the previous volumes - you will probably want to. There is a peace and a reality in Jan Karon's writing. Father Timothy and his wife Cynthia have returned to Mitford after a trip to Ireland. Readers might notice that Father Tim has turned into a bit of a curmudgeon. After such a long absence, it almost seems as if many in the town are irritable. But after all, those of us, of a certain age will probably agree with him...that it is a consolation to see someone doing the same thing over and over again - keeping things the same. He wonders where the barbershops of the past are, where a man could go for some male understanding and it seems like nothing works these days and at times it seems as if everyone is frailer. There are instances when the story seems to hop in time and thought, much like our own minds work in reality, but it can be a bit confusing and other than assuming the reader knows what OMC is we are welcomed into this mountain town. One will smile at thoughts like books take you to other peoples' lives and places, but you can still sit in your chair warm and cozy. This is a book with prayer, where the characters pray for each other to help them in their lives. It is not overwhelming to the story line; but that faith and belief is there. The people readers have come to care about are here, Dooley and his family, Barnabas, Father Tim and Cynthia. We meet some new faces and a story that finally gives the town paper some real news to report. Life happens and even death comes. There are the daily events and they are dealt with; but most of all there is what we have come to hold dear about Mitford...its caring, hope and of course love.

I have read and loved all the books in the Mitford series and I was thrilled when I found out that Jan Karon was back with another book in the series. As soon as it arrived I cleared my schedule and sat down to get reacquainted with all the characters that anybody whose read the series has come to know and love. This latest book in the series is a thick one at 500 pages and I really wanted to read

it slowly to savor every page but once I started I couldn't put it down. It's so easy to get lost in the pages of a Mitford novel and this latest is no exception. I loved it from start to finish and because I don't want to give any spoilers away I'll leave the details of the story out. I will say though that the ending felt like a set up for another book in the series - at least that's what I'm hoping for! If you've been a fan of the other books in the series then you'll be a fan of this one too!
