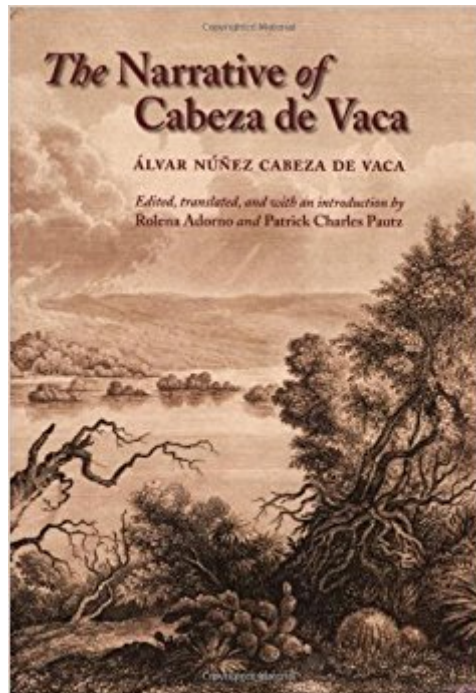

Patrick Charles Pautz holds an M.A. in Spanish from Princeton University and is an independent scholar. Adorno and Pautz coauthored *Álvar Núñez Cabeza de Vaca: His Account, His Life, and the Expedition*
