PreSchool-Grade 1 "After their steamship en route to Boston is wrecked in a storm, a troupe of circus animals escapes bad treatment and disaster, finding its way to an island off the coast of Maine. The 1800s residents are surprised to find zebras eating their gardens and alligators lounging on woodpiles. Sympathies change when a tiger saves a toddler from a blazing shed. When a messenger announces that the cruel circus owner is returning to claim his menagerie, the citizens

assist the animals in disguises and camouflage that confound him, leaving the friends to a peaceful coexistence. Van Dusen's rhymed text keeps a rollicking beat. His illustrations burst with color and energy and utilize perspective and texture to add drama and humor. Period details create a counterpoint with elements like a gorilla in a lifeboat. Mr Van Dusen's books are wonderful- we have time all! Fun, lyrical rhymes with great inventive stories and cheerful hilarious art. Actually fun for the adult to read. My kids 2- 4 love his books. This circus one has an especially fun page where the townspeople are trying to hide the circus animals so the mean ringmaster can't force them back to work for him...the animals are all cleverly camouflaged and our preschooler's had great fun finding them all. This has been my go-to baby gift for years. (Before it was too difficult to get in hardcover, I would give Each Peach Pear Plum...a wonderful book by the husband-and-wife team, Allan & Janet Ahlberg.) The Circus Ship's rhyming is clever, the illustrations are perfectly executed, and there is even a fun seek-and-find which is part of the story. Everyone I have given it to has told me that, after their child was old enough to understand it, The Circus Ship has become their favorite story. I collect children's books (I have hundreds) and Chris Van Dusen is the best! I highly recommend all of his books.

I heard great things about this book and bought it based on these recommendations as a birthday present for my niece. My own children (ages 2.5 and 5) saw it before I had a chance to wrap it and wanted to read it. They were both engaged as we read and we had to look back on the illustrations several times to spot all the little details Van Dusen includes in his work. I will more than likely be buying another copy for us to add to our own library!

There's barely been a month in my son's young life when he wouldn't sit for this whole book. He's

2.5 now, and we both love it. The illustrations are gorgeous and expressive. The story is great. And is this iambic pentameter? It's got a great rhythm and all the elements of a great drama .. act of God, a villain, charming victims, a third-act plot twist (Emma Rose!), and all in a format a 2-year-old can love.
