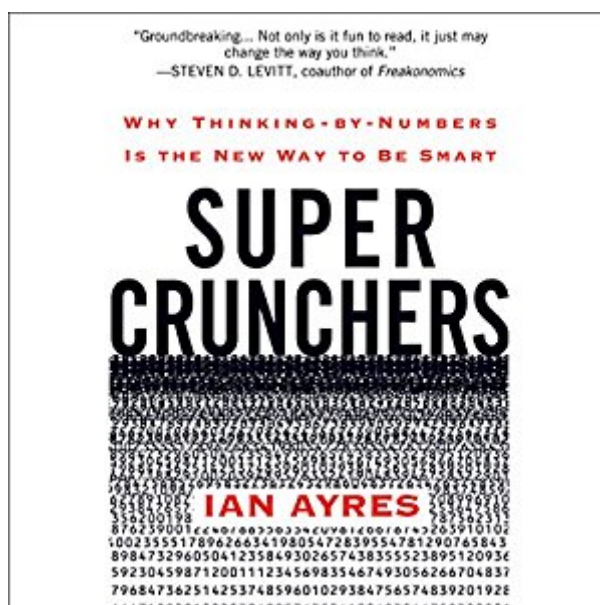

As an open source consultant getting into the Big Data and Analytics-field, this book was an inspirational read about how "thinking by the numbers" really is the new way to be smart, and with hands-on examples about how bad things can go when we leave the decisions to our own device. You won't find anything ground breaking stuff here, but I can assure you that you will find the nuts and bolts of analysis, backed up with stories from the real life. It is an easy read who also gives you a few pointers as to what other literature to read. I can highly recommend it.

"Tried and True" vs Innovative "Rule of Thumb" vs Scientific Method "Gut Hunch" vs Verifiable Methodology
If you are on the left side of each of these pairs - read this to see why "the other side" can be very helpful. If you are on the right side of each of these pairs - read this to see why maybe "vs" should at least be "and" - using scientific method and techniques to quantify or revise the best guesses of "the experts" - combining factors that the experts consider in ways that produce repeatable and verifiable results - from baseball to wine and farther afield.

Despite being nearly a decade old now, it's a great book for a general background in the world of big data. Interesting to see how things have changed since then. For example a TB is not nearly as impressive as it was when this book came out!
